For Deciduous Trees, we offer many choices. Sycamores love wet areas and are great climbing trees for kids, Dogwoods look beautiful in the spring and grow well in shade, and if you love maple syrup, you can't go wrong planting Sugar Maples. We recommend you do some research to see which trees would grow best where you intend to plant them and will provide the look you want. Click the names to go to the Ohio DNR Forestry web site.

For Evergreens, we recommend the Norway Spruce. They grow well and are the beautiful trees you see along Pinewood View Road and on the corner of Village and Greenwood Parkways by the Hamptons.

The lovely Christmas tree at the main entrance started as one of these spruce seedlings, purchased and planted about 12 years ago. (Not a bad looking tree for a buck!)
